About the speaker:

Professor Michael Finus is a Professor in Climate and Environmental Economics since June 2018 at the University of Graz, Austria. He is Deputy Head of the Department of Economics and one of the Pls of the Climate Change Cluster Graz. He held a chair in Environmental Economics at the University of Bath, UK from 2012 until 2018, being Director of Research 2013-2014 and Head of Department, 2014-2017. Previous appointments include Stirling 2007-2009 (Senior Lecture) and Exeter 2009-2011 (Associate Professor). He organized the "Environmental Protection Sustainability Forum" in Exeter, UK in 2011, in Bath, UK, in 2015 and in Graz, Austria, in 2021. He is a co-editor of *Environmental and Resource Economics* since 2012 and was a lead author of the IPCC report 2014. He was Programme Co-Chair of the Scientific Programme of the EAERE-Conference in Manchester in 2019. He has taught on several summer schools before, in particular on the one organized by EAERE in 2000 and 2010 in Venice and at the University of Genoa in 2002

Professor Finus works in the field of environmental economics and public goods, in particular on international environmental agreements. He has published widely in journals such as the Journal of Public Economics, Journal of Public Economic Theory, Social Choice and Welfare, Public Choice, Environmental and Resource Economics and Environment and Development Economics. He also published several books such as Game Theory and *International Environmental Cooperation* (Edward Elgar 2001).
